History of Avondale

The founder of Avondale is considered to be Billy G. Moore. Billy was a bit of a renegade, having supposedly ridden with the infamous Quantrill Gang, a pro-Confederate quasi militia in the Civil War. He moved to the area southwest of Phoenix around 1880, bought 280 acres at a quarter apiece, along the Agua Fria River, and named his little settlement "Coldwater". At that time, he was the largest landowner in that area.

Billy established a stagecoach stop, mostly a freight station. His settlement had a fresh water well, but equally importantly, a saloon and a general store, for the many hot and tired stage drivers crossing the desert to California. Billy also served as Justice of the Peace, and as postmaster for several years until 1905. When the railway established a station at Avondale Ranch, the post office moved there (about a mile west of Coldwater) in the early 1900's, and slowly the name Coldwater was discontinued. The town of Avondale celebrates Billy G. Moore Heritage Days annually.

Nowadays, Avondale is well known as the home of P.I.R. (Phoenix International Raceway). It has developed as a pleasant modern suburban community, with many attractive subdivisions, and large regional shopping areas, easily reachable from all parts of Phoenix. Billy's gone, but he left quite a legacy.




Help Yourself
