History of Glendale

The founding of Glendale has much in common with the establishment of Peoria. William Murphy, who helped establish Peoria, is also the driving force behind the creation of Glendale. The formation of the Arizona Canal Company, which brought irrigation water to the West Valley, was instrumental in making this area arable. The canal project was completed in 1885. Homesteaders soon settled along the canal, including William Bartlett, who established a 640 acre fruit farm in 1886, today known as Saguaro Ranch.

In 1888, Murphy and others began work on the diagonal roadway leading from central Phoenix to the northwest, a road known as Grand Avenue. In early 1892, the first residential area, and then the town site for Glendale, began to take shape, anchored by this new traffic corridor. Soon there was the first school, and then, by the mid 1890's, the Santa Fe Railroad established a pathway through Glendale to points north, such as Prescott and northern Arizona. Now, residents had a much easier time moving produce, and bringing in building materials.



Glendale continued to grow, and prosper, as an agricultural center, with farms, orchards, and cattle ranches, but also a beet sugar processing plant, a flour mill, a creamery, a feed plant, and an ice plant. The advent of WWI, and the consequent high demand for cotton and food, gave Glendale an added boost. Later, it was WWII, and the creation of Thunderbird Field, to train military pilots (now the Thunderbird American Graduate School for Int'I Management-the pilot training facility was moved to Luke Air Force Base, 10 miles west).

Today, Glendale has sports as a mainstay; the AZ Cardinals and Phoenix Coyotes have their stadiums here, which also are the venues for the Tostito's Fiesta Bowl and the BCS Championships. Glendale also plays a big role in Spring Training, with the Camelback Ranch facility, the seasonal home of the L.A. Dodgers and the Chicago White Sox. Education is also a major pillar, with Thunderbird, ASU West, and Midwestern University all calling Glendale home. It seems this city has all the bases covered.
