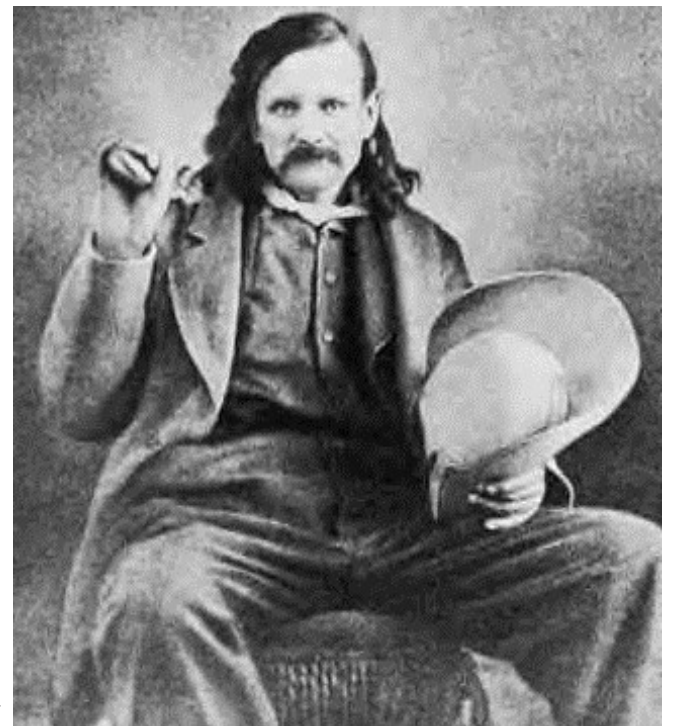

History of Phoenix

Phoenix was founded in 1867, when a man named Jack Swilling came to the area from Wickenburg. Swilling, an adventurer, gold prospector, and member of the "Gila Rangers" militia, saw the potential for agriculture in the abandoned Ho Ho Kam irrigation canals in the Salt River Valley. Many people had commented on the canals before, but Jack was the first to do something about it. He had formed the Swilling Irrigating and Canal Company in Wickenburg, and he and a small party of men moved to the valley to create an up to date system of canals. Within a year, the first crops of wheat, barley, and corn appeared, and this small farming community was started. There were mining camps nearby, and Fort McDowell (built in 1865 as an outpost to combat the Apache from the nearby mountains), but no permanent town existed prior to this.

Crops thrived, trade was established with Fort McDowell and the mining camps, and the town grew; by 1870, there were 235 citizens. It was time to have a name. The names Pumpkinville and Stonewall were proposed, but the assemblage chose Phoenix as the new name. Proposed by a Cambridge educated Englishman named Darrell Duppa, Phoenix was the mythical bird of Egypt which flew into its funeral pyre every millennium, only to reemerge, reinvigorated for another 1000 years. Duppa had originally come to the area with his friend Jack Swilling, and stayed until his death in 1892, naming the towns of Tempe and New River as well.



This was the beginning of one of the major metropolitan areas in the country...

Equipment Spotlight



Water barricade is essential to a safe event, especially if it's a street event. Before September 11 happened, A-frame barricades and bike rack were typically used to block off streets or areas where cars were not supposed to go. We learned from that very sad day that people with the intent to harm do not necessarily care what the obstacles are in the way. Jersey barricades are the heavy-duty cement barricades that you see on the highways during construction. They are definitely safe, but not quite practical for an event. For one, they come in 20-foot sections, which makes it hard to maneuver and not easy to outline a small event or block a small driveway. The water barricade is 7 feet long, making it much more versatile in its uses. Water barricades are more portable, as they are light when they are not filled with water, so many of them can be transported at one time. Once they are filled with water, they act just as a Jersey barricade would. They can also easily be linked together to form one long, solid line of barricade if needed. The best part of all is the expense, and that is always translated down to the customer. Water barricade is not nearly as expensive as the big concrete barricade which makes it more accessible, more readily available, and gives us the ability to provide more pieces of it. In addition to closing off streets and driveways or using it to block off the perimeter of your event you can use water barricade as a weight as well. The picture to the left shows how it was utilized as a base for the scaffolding.
