History of Surprise

The official history starts in 1938, when Flora Mae Statler bought some land northwest of Phoenix, to build inexpensive homes for agricultural workers. She chose the name, because she would be surprised if it ever amounted to much. Other sources state that the city was named by Flora Mae's husband, Harold Ludden, after his hometown of Surprise, Nebraska. Either way, recent documents show that Flora Mae bought the land before she met Harold, a developer and state legislator; you decide.

Original inhabitants would have been the Ho Ho Kam native Americans, but they abandoned the area in the 1400's, so whatever name they might have had is lost in history. The square mile had a few houses and a gas station, not much else. It might have remained a sleepy little farming community of irrigated orchards and fields, producing lots of cotton, except for Grand Avenue and the railroad.



The 100 foot wide Grand Avenue was built in 1888, connecting Phoenix to Glendale, Peoria, and eventually provided a major artery to Las Vegas, passing directly by where Surprise would later arise. The railroad came through in 1895, running parallel to Grand Avenue, and running through to Prescott. Now the West Valley moved from agriculture only to an industrial/agricultural economy, and Surprise developed along those lines.

Sun City Grand, a very large retirement community, was built in Surprise, just up the road from Sun City and Sun City West. The Texas Rangers and Kansas City Royals hold Spring Training at Surprise Stadium. Surprise is the home of AZTechCelerator, a 4 building campus to provide affordable facilities for business start ups through late stage innovation companies. As of 2010, it is the 10th largest city in Arizona. Flora Mae would indeed be surprised.
