Stay safe- Through a rapists eyes

A group of rapists and date rapist in prison were interviewed on what they look for in a potential victim and here are some interesting facts:

1)The first thing men look for in a potential victim is hair style. They are most likely to go after a woman with a ponytail, bun, braid or other hairstyle that can be easily grabbed. They are also likely to go after a woman with long hair..

Women with short hair are not common targets.

2) The second thing men look for is clothing. They will look for women who's clothing is easy to remove quickly. Many of them carry scissors around to cut clothing.

3)They also look for women on their cell phones, searching through their purses or doing other activities while walking because they are off and can be easily overpowered.

10) If someone is following behind you on a street or in a garage or with you on an elevator or stairwell, look them in the face and ask them a question, like what time is it or make general small talk. Now you have seen their face and could identify them in a lineup, you lose appeal as a target.

11)If someone is coming toward you hold out your hands in front of you and yell stop or stay back!! Most of the rapist this man talked to said they would leave a woman alone if she yelled or showed that she would fight back. Again they are looking for an EASY target.

Please do not forget that July 4th is around the corner, a very busy day for us. Please also try to keep up to date on both the newsletter and our web page (www.teamsecurity.net) for upcoming events and happenings.

Now that summer is upon us, I would also like to remind everybody to make sure you drink plenty of liquids, and try and stay cool in the heat.

Dehydration and heat stroke are a very real and constant danger in the Arizona heat. If you stop sweating, it is already too late. Heat stroke is very dangerous, because it does not give you any warning signs. We try and provide water at every event, but do not rely on us being able to get you breaks as often as you should be drinking. Make sure you bring a big water

bottle with you. If you see someone who looks disoriented, has flush skin, feels cool to the touch often, and who is not sweating, you can be pretty sure you are dealing with a victim of dehydration. Get them out of the sun, cooled down and start getting liquids (slowly) into them. It is important that you get the paramedics to check them out, because even if they think they feel well, it is rarely the case.

There is rarely a dull moment in our little world of security, and of late there have been several incidents where people have gotten terminated for acts of gross negligence to their responsibilities.
