If you must cancel your shift, you must do so with a minimum of 12 hours notice and you must call the scheduling pager (602-219-8326) and leave a number where the scheduler can reach you. You may not just leave a message saying that you are canceling; you must speak to a scheduler. If you do not call 12 hours before your shift start time, this is considered a no show. You will be asked to account for needing to cancel, and must be able to show proof/ documentation of an emergency to HR, or you will be pulled from your upcoming shifts in the schedule.

### 3. Lake Pleasant:

We actually work this account periodically, and I have been assured it is a good place to pick back and what happens in Lake Pleasant stays at Lake Pleasant - Walter Miller :)

---19 miles NW of Peoria on State Rt 74 off Castle Hot Springs Road

### 4. Canyon Lake:

I think it is easily the most beautiful. And if you at all like hiking, they have several great trails or varying abilities. The views are incredible, and the water is clear. Fisherman--- good stuff here. It is more of a drive, but even the drive is pretty remarkable.

From the Phoenix area to Canyon Lake, Arizona: Take Highway 60 (Superstition Freeway) to Apache Junction. Exit at Idaho Road and turn North to Highway 88 (Apache Trail). Travel 14 miles Northeast on the paved Historic Apache Trail. Just past the second one-lane bridge, turn left into the Canyon Lake Marina and Campground.

### 5. Fish Creek Canyon:

The best of the hidden gems. (remember discussing this place Jess?)

Tucked away, quiet, and when the water is coming over the mesa in a waterfall, absolutely spellbinding. Because of how it sits in the rocks, the canyon is always cool, and is fairly safe for big dogs to run, as there aren't really cacti and the usual evil fauna. I doesn't even seem like you are in Arizona.

Downstream: Fish Creek crosses AZ 88, the Apache Trail, 2 miles east of the point where the sur-

face becomes unpaved, and about 25 miles from Apache Junction; there is no signpost but it is easily recognized as the road descends steeply along the edge of a deep ravine, and crosses the stream way on quite a high bridge. o. The lower section may also be reached by FR 80, a side road that links the Apache Trail with Horse Mesa Dam at the head of Apache Lake.

So the other part of Solstice time of getting a bit more in touch with nature, and these are just some places I have found that visiting makes living here in the summer a bit more habitable.
