This is your chance to own the world famous Tommy gun, the gun made famous by the gangsters of the Al Capone Era and Bonnie And Clyde. It was the era of the start of the FBI, Elliot Ness and the "Untouchables". Not too much later, the Tommy gun was issued to our Marines fighting in the pacific and the Army fighting in Europe to defeat the Axis powers in World War II. This is an amazing gun, harder to find, and at the same time so much fun to shoot. Even though it is a 45 caliber, it has virtually no recoil, and feels like you are firing marshmallows. It comes with one stick magazine, like issued to our G.I.'s in WWII, but the gangster days drums (50 and 100 round magazines) are still available to buy. This gun was used by the US military until 1971, and is still used by many militaries though out the world. Be aware this is a fairly heavy gun (almost 13 lbs., and about another 6 lbs. for a full 100 round magazine)!

This gun comes NIB, with a carrying case (which does have a minor blemish), sling, manual and registration card.

Price \$1200 plus sales tax, and layaway is available.

Smith and Wesson Lady Smith Revolver Model 65-5 357 Magnum



This 3 inch barrel, slim grip and fixed sight revolver is a great investment and extremely reliable gun. 6 shot capacity, it is a high stopping power, yet low profile protector, suitable for anyone. Don't let the name Lady Smith fool you – This is enough gun for both men and women. Gently used, this gun is a steal at \$550, (most on line prices are around \$700), and comes with a soft sided carrying case. This is a private sale.

Looking for uniform pants, belts, shoes, etc? Here are some companies you can try:

<u>FX Tactical</u> (next to Shooter's World): They usually have good deals and quite a few clearance racks; they are extremely friendly and knowledgeable and very willing to share their knowledge with the customer.

Camelback Uniform: They are pricey but their pants and shorts are reasonable

Galls: They are pricey but they do have the occasional awesome deal

Universal Police Supply: The shop is located locally in Tempe.

Ace Uniforms: They are good but they usually are pretty busy and cater to more of the big city departments. The plus side is they can usually do a lot of tailoring on site in less than an hour. They have a huge inventory

<u>Dave's Uniforms</u> in Avondale: he's a medically retired cop and he is honest and usually has more inventory than the bigger shops. He takes a lot a pride in his work and he will only sell what you need, so it's harder to blow a paycheck there. He usually is lower priced too because he runs it out of his house and therefore isn't trying to make up expensive retail rent with his pricing.

LA Police Gear currently has these uniform pants on sale for \$20 if you are looking for uniform pants. They always have great deals, especially if you sign up with your email.

<u>Chief Supply</u>: They are pricey but good for comparison and the occasional deal.

Blackhawk: They have versatile equipment and a lot of interchangeable equipment.

Ebay: Trent Loveless is willing to do eBay shopping for you, to get duty belts and stuff like that. He usually charges 5-10 bucks above the final auction price and just stays in the price range of whatever you want or can afford to spend, if you are looking for belts and things like that .
